Warm Up Activity:
Discuss Context Notes on Miller & *The Crucible* as it pertains to Puritanism & American History/Literature

Prep Activity

- Students will take context notes and share prior knowledge about McCarthyism, Puritanism, and literary elements.
 - Remind them of terms that they do not readily come up with but should already be aware of
 - drama - comedy/tragedy
 - plot
 - dialogue
 - monologue
 - theme
 - character
 - etc. (2.5 days)
 - The warm up will culminate in expository excerpts and questions that reflect the subject matter (per teacher handouts)

Lesson/Procedures:
Students will actively listen and take contextual notes on Miller/McCarthyism/Puritanism/Objectives for the unit - see Dolar unit plan folder for specifics (2 days).
Students will read *The Crucible* out loud as a group as well as portions at home as individuals (10 days).
Students will complete a study guide that requires answers to critical thinking questions in regard to character/plot/literary elements as a during reading activity (HW).
