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Student Groups	Class Groups
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Used to group individual students (a single student can be in only <i>one</i> student group at a time)</li> <li>• Can be used to give different assignments to different groups of students (e.g., based on abilities, interests, behaviors, etc.)</li> <li>• Created on the <b>Student Groups</b> screen, accessed from the <b>Teacher Home Page</b> screen <b>Set Up Groups Within Classes</b> link</li> <li>• Can include students from multiple classes</li> <li>• Sometimes referred to as “groups within classes”</li> <li>• Can be used to maintain assignments in one location for all students in the group</li> <li>• Can be assigned a VirtualClassroom activity</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Used to group entire classes together (a single class can belong to multiple class groups)</li> <li>• Often used by special education teachers, music teachers, or physical education teachers who have students scheduled in several classes</li> <li>• Created on the <b>Class Groups</b> screen, accessed from the <b>Teacher Home Page</b> screen <b>Group Classes Together</b> link</li> <li>• Creates a combined class roster with its own <b>Class Dashboard</b></li> <li>• Can be used on seating charts</li> <li>• Can be used for entering period attendance</li> <li>• Can be used to enter report card grades</li> <li>• Can be used to maintain assignments in one location for all students <i>unless</i> classes contain different subjects or report cards</li> <li>• Displays in <b>Class</b> drop-down lists throughout the application</li> <li>• Can be used on <b>Progress By Student</b> and <b>Standards-Based Grid</b> screens <i>unless</i> individual classes are associated with different report cards</li> <li>• Can be assigned a VirtualClassroom activity</li> </ul>
