Questions

- You can now add a new question type, fill-in-the-blank drag & drop, to quizzes. This question type lets you add text containing blanks to which students can drag possible answers from a bank. You can also indicate whether you want to scramble responses or let students use the same responses for multiple blanks. (*ProgressBook VirtualClassroom Teacher Guide*)
- When you create a Math Problem question, the MathType tools are now labeled **Math Editor** in the rich text tools. (*ProgressBook VirtualClassroom Teacher Guide*)
- The rich text editor's user interface has been updated. (*ProgressBook VirtualClassroom Teacher Guide*)

- (D14036) Previously, when you created a quiz using the **Expanded View**, the **Questions** and **Points** header did not update when you added, modified, or deleted questions from the quiz until you refreshed the screen. Now, the **Questions** and **Points** header updates without you refreshing the screen.

ProgressBook Library

- (D14707,14735) Previously, when you imported a course into the ProgressBook Library, question text displayed incorrectly on quiz activities when the question contained certain XML characters (“<,” “>,” “,”). Now, the characters and questions import correctly.

Resolved Issues

Activities

- (D12301) Previously, when the first class in the class order (designated on the GradeBook **Class Setup** screen) was a class group, you were unable to preview an activity as a student. Now, you can preview an activity even when a class group is the first in the class order.

Grading

- (D14858) Previously, when you set an activity's due date to a date in a future reporting period and did not select the **Preview before post?** checkbox on the **Assignment Details** screen in GradeBook, when the appropriate grading period became active, student averages did not include the mark on the activity created prior to the reporting period. Now, in these circumstances, student averages correctly include the activity's mark.
